

#### Valued Partnership with SAP

We are delighted that our school is beginning an eighth year of partnership with SAP Ireland through the Business in the Community initiative. In the initial years of the partnership, many of



our 5th year students completed the Skills@Work programme. Since last year, the focus has now moved to the 2nd year cohort and this year 28 of our 2nd years will participate in the World of Work (WOW) programme. During this online modular programme, they will gain insights into the world of work by reflecting on their skills, their ambitions and looking at key concepts like teamwork and communications. They will meet with SAP employees from all over the world and even meet the Managing Director, Mr. Liam Ryan as part of the next workshop in January.
