language option. Organised by the ATI, the association of Italian teachers in Ireland, 1st year students had to record a video of themselves presenting an Italian person they admire. Five video entries were submitted from each school and Archie's entry, in which he introduced the legendary Italian goalkeeper, Gianluigi Buffon, was commended by the judges. We are particularly delighted that one of our students was so successful as this is the first year that we have Italian as a curricular option for first years. Archie received his prize in the Italian Cultural Institute in Dublin from Salvo Cacciato, President of the ATI.
