A game which fell victim to the recent adverse weather conditions, finally took place after a late change of venue as the pitch in Mullingar was covered in snow. The game took place in the idyllic surrounds of Barrowhouse Co. Laois.

The game was dramatic to say the least, Cillian Manders suffered a head injury near the end of the first half and a sizeable delay ensued for the arrival of ambulance.

St. Farnan's went into an early lead but were pegged back by a fine Killina goal. The first half there after was nip and tuck with St. Farnan's gifting possession to Killina time and time again. The first half would end on a premature note 1-3 to D-6 due to Cillian's injury.

After a sizeable delay and daylight fading fast, the second half got under way. St. Farnan's seemed to handle the delay much better and Billy Maher kicked a number of excellent points to extend the lead. The vital score of the second half came mid way through the second half when Eoin Bagnall was fouled in the box. Darren Judge showed huge composure to convert and put St. Farnan's into a 6 point lead.

Killina then staged a dramatic onslaught of the Farnan's goal but heroic and stout defending from Mark Byrne and P.J. Ewing among others repelled them again and again as they searched in vain for that elusive goal. The final whistle sounded in almost near darkness and St. Farnan's had qualified for their first ever All- Ireland semi final.

St. Cuan's Castleblakeney, Galway 2-08

Just four days after our dramatic victory over Killina, we travelled to Tubberclair Co. Westmeath to take on the Connacht champions St. Cuan's. This was an historic game for St. Farnan's GAA as it was our first appearance in an All-Ireland semi-final.

St. Farnan's unfortunately left their shooting boots behind them as they kicked nine wides in the first half while St. Cuan's were far more economical kicking 5 points from 6 attempts. This left the score St. Cuan's 0-5 St. Farnan's 0-3.

St. Cuan's started the second half in whirlwind fashion as after a fine team move they scored a goal 3D seconds into the second half. St. Farnan's pulled a couple of points back but all hope of a comeback were extinguished after a second goal by St. Cuan's. However much credit must be given to St. Farnan's for the heart and determination they showed throughout the match and the campaign to date.

St. Cuan's would go on to win the All-Ireland after beating Colaiste Ailigh, Letterkenny, Co. Donegal, but all hope is not lost for this group of players as they now await the winners of the Dublin Championship (Moyle Park v St. Vincent's C.B.S) in their first Leinster Post-Primary Senior Final in the coming weeks.
